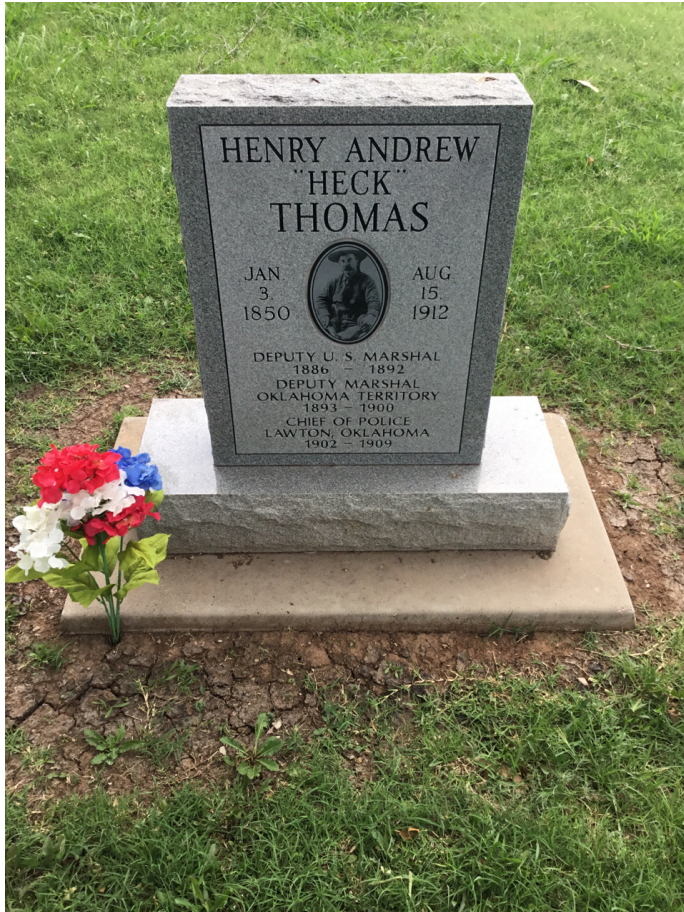

EXCAVATION AND SITE PREPARATION:

- Excavate dirt for four concrete pads with dimensions 9 inches by 72 inches by 121 inches each
- Excavate and prepare site for concrete curb installation 484 feet long by 6 inches deep
- Tear out existing concrete sidewalk completely to bare soil, dimensions 20 feet by 4 feet wide by 4 feet deep, removing all debris to bare earth
- Excavate 6 inches total depth for concrete slab measuring 210 feet long by 20 inches wide
- Operate mini excavator and skid steer with bucket attachment for all excavation work
- Grade and level all excavated areas to proper elevation
- Remove and haul away all excavated soil and concrete debris from site

BASE PREPARATION AND MATERIAL INSTALLATION:

- Install 2 inches of 1.5 inch crusher run base material for concrete slab measuring 210 feet long by 20 inches wide
- Compact and level all base materials to proper grade
- Prepare subgrade for all four concrete pads ensuring proper drainage slope
- Prepare subgrade for curb installation 484 feet long ensuring proper slope for mower access

Unfinished Business

1. Continue discussion regarding swapping the 75% and 25% revenue split, so 75% of HLC revenue goes into the Cemetery Carefund and 25% goes into the General Fund.

Donald Kousman states that he is still putting information together regarding the discussion to either swap the 75% and 25% of revenue that goes into the general city fund versus what goes into the Cemetery Care Fund. Currently, 75% of Highland Cemetery's revenue goes into the general fund for the City while 25% goes back into the Cemetery Care Fund. The Cemetery Sexton would like to either swap the percentages or even it out at 50-50. Donald Kousman continues to state that this change would help reduce strain on the general budget, as his equipment needs could come from the Cemetery's care fund rather than the city's budget.

Kelly Harris asks what effect this would have on each fund.

Donald Kousman states that last year the cemetery brought in \$100K, and if a larger percentage of that went into the cemetery's care fund then he wouldn't have had to use as much budget funds to purchase equipment.

Kelly Harris asks if anything has been done regarding the fence vandalism and what the repairs have been.

Donald Kousman states that they have been able to patch the fence where it gets cut.

Kelly Harris asks about the CIP funds that were designed for cemetery repairs.

Donald Kousman states that they never saw that money come in. The last quote on the fence work was a very high amount.

Barry Beauchamp states he would like to see a staggered fence to hopefully eliminate the cutting, or a solid metal fence.

Kelly Harris follows up by saying that it will continue to be cut unless a proper fence is built.

If participation at any public meeting is not possible due to a disability, notification to the City Clerk at (580) 581-3305 at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled meeting is encouraged to make the necessary accommodations. The City may waive the 48 hour rule if interpreters for the deaf (signing) is not the necessary accommodation."
