NEW BUSINESS:

1. Consider discussing the status of the COVID-19 Pandemic as it relates to the City of Lawton, including the Proclamation declaring a civil emergency and amendments thereto to date, additional amendments to the Proclamation, uniformity in the issuance of rules and regulations contained in the amendments and their application throughout the City, and take appropriate action as deemed necessary. MOVED by Warren SECOND by Hampton to prohibit golf, frisbee golf, tennis, sale of sporting goods, furniture, big box stores cannot sell clothing or sporting goods, touchless car washes are allowed with no employees. This is effective April 3, 2020 at noon. AYE: Chapman, Burk, Hampton, Johnson, Warren, Hankins. NAY: Fortenbaugh. MOTION CARRIED.

MOVED by Burk SECOND by Chapman to limit social gatherings to no more than 6, with funerals limited to no more than 10. AYE: Burk, Hampton, Fortenbaugh, Johnson, Warren, Hankins, Chapman. NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.

MOVED by Burk SECOND by Warren to have an essential letter used for essential businesses during their travel. AYE: Burk, Hampton, Johnson, Warren, Hankins, Chapman. NAY: Fortenbaugh. MOTION CARRIED.

MOVED by Burk SECOND by Hampton to approve a curfew from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m., shopping allowed only for essential workers. AYE: Burk, Hampton, Warren, Hankins, Chapman. NAY: Fortenbaugh, Johnson. MOTION CARRIED.

MOVED by Warren SECOND by Burk to recommend requiring of signage and monitoring of social distancing, one-cart/one-shopper at certain facilities with one way aisles, requiring of sneeze guards at indoor points of transaction, requiring of sanitation at points of transaction, requiring of sanitation wipes or gloves or paper towels at gas pumps, reduction of occupancy level with one person per 500 square feet not to exceed 100 individuals . AYE: Johnson, Warren, Hankins, Chapman, Burk, Hampton, Fortenbaugh. NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.

MOVED by Burk SECOND by Warren to make all previous motion items go into effect April 6, 2020 at 11 p.m. with occupancy numbers will going into effect April 3, 2020 at 5 p.m. AYE: Warren, Hankins, Chapman, Burk, Hampton, Fortenbaugh, Johnson. NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.
