City Ordinance currently states: Hunting in the area of the recreational vehicle race track at Lake Ellsworth as described in Section 19-603A below, is permitted only from the last Saturday in October to December 15 of each year. During this period when hunting in the area is authorized, recreational vehicles shall not be operated on the race track. (19-4-412-B-2)

On the west side of Lake Lawtonka, hunting is only allowed from October 1 through January 15. (19-4-412-A-3)
